

Cataract Surgery

Recovery



Cataract surgery recovery is also one of the most concerned aspects of cataract removal, especially the time required in

restoration of functional vision after the procedure.

You're expected to take the first follow-up visit to your ophthalmologist within the first few days after the cataract surgery, followed by a subsequent visit within the first few weeks. In most of the cases, you're prescribed with specific types of eye drops to reduce

inflammation and protect against infection.

Most people observe an improvement in their visual function within several days of the surgery, enabling them to restart most of their daily activities including work. However, you need to have several visits to the doctor, who monitors and observes your eye(s) for any signs of complications.

Majority of people regain full activity after a few days of getting treated. Your doctor might fit you with a pair of glasses (if needed) once your vision is stabilized. This also depends upon the type of intraocular lens implanted in your eye.

There is also a possibility that you are unable to get cataract surgery, due to old age, for example. If so, you

may consult your doctor for resorting to some of the contemporary low vision aids like IrisVision, which are designed to augment your visual capacity, returning you some of the independence that you once enjoyed before falling victim to this eye disease
